### Trans Atlantic Consumer Dialogue

### **TACD BULLETIN • November 2015**

Talks during the 11<sup>th</sup> TTIP negotiating round in Miami at the end of October covered a range of areas, from market access to regulatory issues. The US tabled proposals on regulatory coherence, technical barriers to trade and customs and trade facilitation, while the EU tabled its proposal on sustainable development.

Last week, the European Commission sent its <u>final proposal for an Investment</u> <u>Court System (ICS)</u> in TTIP to the US, making it an official negotiation document.

Also, earlier this month, the <u>full text</u> of the Trans-Pacific Partnership (TPP) was released. The document is an important resource as it includes US positions on areas of relevance for TTIP and TiSA.

Protection of fundamental privacy rights has continued to be a priority. TACD called on data protection officials at the <u>International Privacy Conference</u> in Amsterdam to support a comprehensive privacy legal framework. In Washington, TACD representatives met US and EU officials, to ensure that safe harbour 2.0 does not undermine EU data protection.

## European Commission publishes first detailed TTIP negotiation report

In line with its transparency policy, the European Commission published for the first time ever a <u>detailed report of the 11<sup>th</sup> negotiating round</u>.

The Commission also published its textual proposals for an <u>article on Anti-Microbial Resistance</u> within the SPS Chapter of TTIP and a <u>sustainable development chapter</u> (see <u>press release</u>), as well as its proposal to establish a <u>SME committee</u> within the framework of the SME chapter.

The 12<sup>th</sup> TTIP negotiating round will take place in Brussels, likely in February 2016.

### **TACD** meetings in Washington

Anna Fielder, TACD's Senior Policy Advisor, together with members of the TACD Steering Committee and US-based members, met with both US and EU officials in Washington in early November. Anna, Jean Halloran (Consumers Union) and Melinda St. Louis (Public Citizen) met with USTR lead TTIP negotiators Ann Heilman-Dahl (SPS) and Rachel Shub (regulatory cooperation) to discuss progress after the 11<sup>th</sup> negotiating round.

Anna, Susan Grant (CFA) and Jeff Chester (CDD) also met with USTR negotiator on ecommerce, Robb Tanner, as well as with the digital team at the EU delegation, to ensure that EU data protection is not undermined by a revamped safe harbour agreement.

In addition, meetings were held at the US State Department and the EU delegation to discuss a number of issues of importance to consumer groups in TTIP and beyond.

### TACD members meet EU Justice Commissioner to discuss Safe Harbour 2.0

On 13 November, TACD members met with Commissioner Věra Jourová during her visit to Washington DC, to raise concerns about the so-called "Safe Harbour 2.0" agreement that the EU is currently negotiating with the US. TACD members **Center for Digital Democracy** (CDD) and the **Electronic Privacy Information Center** (EPIC) called on the Commissioner to urge the US to enact comprehensive privacy legislation and other legal safeguards that would protect both the American and EU public. In the absence of an effective framework for data protection, any new safe harbour agreement would likely be rejected by the EU court, they said. A number of TACD members and other civil society groups sent <u>a letter</u> to Commissioner Jourová and the US Secretary of Commerce laying out these and other issues.

### European Commission's expert advisory group on TTIP

Monique Goyens (BEUC) and, on behalf of TACD, Benedicte Federspiel (Danish Consumer Council) participated in the most recent meeting of the European Commission's expert advisory group on TTIP on 10 November 2015. Key issues discussed included regulatory cooperation and the EC's Investment Court System proposal.

# TACD calls for the protection of fundamental privacy rights at the 37<sup>th</sup> ICPDP

TACD's efforts to advocate for the need to protect fundamental rights in the online era continued throughout the past month. At the 37<sup>th</sup> International Conference of Privacy and Data Protection Commissioners held in Amsterdam at the end of October, a EU-US TACD delegation strongly argued for the need to support a comprehensive fundamental rights framework on data protection. One of the highlights of the conference was the release of a so-called <u>"Bridges" report</u> on transatlantic cooperation and privacy.

In a <u>statement</u> released at the start of the "bridges" debate, TACD, alongside leading privacy and consumer organisations, criticised the report, which primarily recommended a continuation of industry self-regulation to address privacy, without proposing any substantive legislative changes. The paper's failure to address the consequences of the European Court of Justice safe harbour decision made it "remarkably out of touch with the current legal reality".

Together with the other consumer and data protection groups, TACD urged all nations to adopt and strengthen a meaningful privacy legal framework.
