# EU institutions reach agreement on data protection package

After close to four years of negotiations, the EU data protection reform was concluded on 15 December 2015. The European Commission, Parliament and Council reached an agreement on a legislative package consisting of two legislative instruments: the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) and a Directive which applies to law enforcement (police and the judiciary). These laws will have an impact on the EU-US data transfers and the safe harbour negotiations and, most likely, on the "data flows" provisions in TTIP.

EU and US TACD members alike reacted to the new EU data protection package. <u>EDRi</u> described it as "lacking ambition but saving the basics" and <u>BEUC</u> highlighted that "although imperfect", the package will strengthen the fundamental right to personal data protection. In a blog post, <u>Privacy International</u> pointed out that key concerns remain, like the "effective supervisory role of the data protection authorities, or potentially allowing for transfers of highly sensitive data to authorities in third countries without serious safeguards". In its statement, US member <u>EPIC</u> calls on the US to

modernise privacy laws to "safeguard U.S. consumers and maintain trade relations with Europe".

Data protection reform is a legislative package proposed by the EU Commission in 2012 to modernise data protection laws and harmonise privacy rules across the EU.

The final vote by the European Parliament in full plenary is due in January 2016. The regulation will take effect two years after its entry into force.

## Access to all confidential TTIP documents granted to all MEPs

The European Commission will allow all European Parliament members to access all confidential documents related to TTIP. This includes consolidated texts, which present both EU and U.S. negotiating positions. Access to the texts will be granted in a secure reading room at the European Parliament and MEPs will be allowed to take handwritten notes.
